

Session 1

Check Homework

Check the homework assignment from the previous lesson.

Warm-up

Tell the students that you are going to say six things about yourself. Three sentences are true and three are false. They have to guess which are true.

- a. Write the six sentences on the board.
- b. Students copy the three sentences they think are true.
- c. Read each sentence slowly and check students' guesses. Count and record how many votes each sentence got.
- d. Tell the students the correct answers.

Sample sentences:

I didn't wake up on time this morning.

I didn't watch TV last night.

I didn't like chocolate when I was nine years old.

I didn't have many books when I was twelve years old.

I didn't have a dog when I was a child.

I didn't live here ten years ago.

Discussion I

Elicit what is common in all the sentences (negative in the past).

Elicit how the Past Simple negative is formed.

Ask students to make two of the sentences on the board affirmative. What happens to the verb? Compare the two affirmative sentences with the four negative ones.

Movie

Watch the movie.

Ask students if anything like that ever happened to them. What didn't Ben do? Do they think Ben will study for the new quiz?

Practice

Elicit responses from students about what they did on each day of the week, using the Past Simple. If needed, prompt them with the verbs. Write their sentences on the board. Ask students to write the sentences in the negative. They should underline the days of the week.

Here are examples of possible sentences.

I studied for the guiz in English on Sunday.

We went to school on Monday.

We had a quiz on Tuesday.

We watched a movie on Wednesday.

They felt terrible on Thursday. I visited my uncle on Friday.

He made pizza on Saturday.



Session 1 (cont.)

Discussion II

Ask students to look at the names of the days on the board.

What can they tell you about these names? (they all end with day / capital letters / end of sentence / they all have **on** before them / Sunday is named after the sun, Monday after the moon)

Tell students that when we talk about days, we usually use **on** before the day.

For example: on Sunday / on my birthday

Homework

Ask students to write 6 Past Simple negative sentences about themselves. Three sentences should be true and three false. They can refer to the sentences they copied in class. Remind students how to make Past Simple negative sentences. Remind students that their classmates will have to guess which sentences are true.

Sum-up

Who was it? (students' names)

- a. Who didn't read a book today?
- b. Who didn't write a letter today?
- c. Who didn't come to class today?
- d. Who didn't walk outside on ____day?

What day is it?

- a. What day is today?
- b. What day was yesterday?

Give an example of something you learned today.



Session 2

Check Homework Call on individual students to read their true/false sentences.

Ask their peers to guess the true sentences.

Warm-up

Review the days of the week and introduce the new lexical items:

movie / quiz / school / study / watch

Challenge the students to use two of the words in a negative

Past Simple sentence.

Movie

Watch the movie.

Practice I

Write these expressions on the board. Students work with a partner and

take turns saying what they did or didn't do yesterday.

Each student must say five sentences.
